Competition Terms and Information Packet

ELIGIBILITY

Amateur – Amateur events are open to all amateur dancers

***Mixed Proficiency Events** are open to any combination of:

1. A more advanced amateur dancing with a less-experienced partner. *Only the less experienced partner will be judged.*
2. A professional dancer dancing with an amateur. *Only the amateur will be judged.*

* Please note that each partner must fill out an entry form and pay the entry fee.

PRIZES:

Ribbons will be offered in all events.

FORMAT AND GENERAL RULES:

1. All events will be danced in the freestyle format to music selected by the DJ / organizers. There will be no solo exhibitions.
2. There are no syllabus restrictions. Dancers will be judged based on quality of dancing.
3. Anyone may lead or follow, however leaders and followers must maintain the same role for the duration of each entry

LEVELS OFFERED:

Newcomer

Beginner (approximates to Bronze)

Intermediate (approximates to Silver)

Advanced (approximates to Gold)

Novice, Pre-Championship, and Championship / Open*

**Certain styles only. See Registration website for more information.*

There are no syllabus restrictions. Dancers will be judged based on quality of dancing.

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PROFICIENCY LEVELS:

Newcomer Events (Ballroom Styles): open to people who started dancing after August 1, 2023. To be eligible for Newcomer, this must be the competitor's first partner dance competition.

Competitors may dance at two consecutive proficiency levels for each ballroom dance style entered.

Acceptable combinations of proficiency levels are:

Newcomer* and Beginner

Beginner and Intermediate (plus Novice if desired)

Intermediate and Advanced (plus Novice if desired)

Advanced and Novice

Novice and Pre-Championship

Pre-Championship and Championship

*Newcomers are encouraged to enter Beginner as well.

Ballroom and Country Proficiency

1. Proficiency is by style of dance.

For each style of dance entered, a competitor is restricted to

- a. Two consecutive proficiency levels OR
- b. Two consecutive non-open proficiency levels plus Novice.

For example, a person who is dancing both Intermediate and Advanced Standard Waltz must also complete in Intermediate and Advanced Standard Tango, but would be eligible to dance Beginner and Intermediate levels in the Latin dances (S / CC / R / Pa / J). This person would also be eligible to compete in Novice in both Standard and Latin.

Mixed Proficiency entries where the competitor is dancing as the unjudged higher-level partner do not count towards the two consecutive level limit (see rules for Mixed Proficiency entrants in the Eligibility section above)

2. *Novice Events.* Novice is the first open level and is open to any competitor who is competing in the pre-open levels of the same style or in Pre-Championship. Championship dancers are not eligible to compete in Novice.

Social Dances Proficiency

For the social competition ONLY, competitors may dance in one proficiency level PER DANCE.

Example: a couple could dance Beginner Salsa and Advanced Argentine Tango.

Country Dances Proficiency

Country competitors may enter at the Beginning, Advanced or Open levels.

Beginning Country. open to people who started dancing after August 1, 2023. To be eligible for Beginning, this must be the competitor's first partner dance competition.

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Advanced Country: open to competitors with some country competition experience, including those who dance in Newcomer at UCDWC and ACDA competitions or have competed in country events at collegiate competitions.

Open Country: Intended for competitors who compete in Novice or above at UCDWC and ACDA competitions.

General Proficiency Notes:

1. Competitors who have accumulated proficiency points on the USADance, Collegiate, or NDCA circuits are requested to abide by those categories.
2. Competitors may register for as many styles of dances as they would like.
3. **If you have been placing regularly in a given proficiency level at previous competitions, we strongly urge you to dance up to the next level of proficiency rather than dancing down. This provides a more fair competition for newer dancers, and also challenges each competitor to continually develop his or her dancing.**

All competitors certify by signing the entry form that they are eligible to compete in the events they have marked on the entry form. If a competitor is under 18, a parent or guardian must sign the entry form.

AGE CATEGORIES

Three age categories will be offered at this year's Austin Open for Mixed Proficiency and Am-Am. These categories will be

Youth (up to 17)

Collegiate/A1 (18-34)

A2 (35+).

GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP

We reserve the right to disqualify any couple or individual found to be competing in an unsportsmanlike manner. If any inappropriate behavior is seen on the day of competition, we strongly urge witnesses to find one of the Competition Directors immediately to report the incidents so that proper measures may be taken.

SYLLABUS

There are no syllabus restrictions. Dancers will be judged based on quality of dancing.

COSTUMES AND DRESS CODE:

Costumes:

Costumes are permitted, but not required, in any level of competition.

Jeans: No jeans

Embellishments: **No glitter.** This is a restriction imposed by the venue. Competitors wearing costumes with glitter will not be permitted to enter the ballroom. Other embellishments such as rhinestones, sequins, etc. are permitted.

Props: No props will be permitted in any event except for hats used for Country Western. Examples of prohibited items are wands and capes.

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Shoes: Dance shoes are required. No flip flops, slides, crocs, or street shoes. Dance boots are permitted in Country Western events.

Hats: Hats are permitted in Country Western events only.

Suggested dress for Newcomer events*:

*Note: anyone may lead or follow for the duration of an event. There is no dress code for leaders or followers. The traditional options are described below for information.

American Smooth and International Standard Events: (traditional option)

Leaders: Dark slacks and white shirt closed at the neck, tie, vest optional.

Followers: Leotards and wrap skirts or party or cocktail dresses (***NO GLITTER***). Longer skirts suggested but not required. Rhinestone jewelry is permitted. Costumes are permitted.

American Rhythm and International Latin Events: (traditional option)

Leaders: Dark slacks and black or white shirt, black T-shirt without logos or designs, or black turtleneck.

Followers: Same as for Smooth/Standard. (***NO GLITTER***) Shorter skirts are suggested for ease of movement but not required. Costumes are permitted.

ENTRY RULES AND DEADLINE

Early Registration Deadline:

Entries must be received online by 11:59 PM on Friday March 29.

** Late registration and late payment will be accepted according to the deadlines below**

Late Registration Deadline:

10:00 AM on Saturday, April 6

Entries received after 11:59 PM on Friday March 29 will incur full price (\$10 more than early bird)

Payments:

1. All payments must be made prior to or during check-in at the competition.

Please print and sign waivers prior to the event to expedite check-in.

Registration is required to compete in all categories and events.
